A BILL

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6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 11-6-302 (a) (ix) (B) (II), (x) (B) (I) and
- 9 (II), 23-1-101(a) (viii) (B) (II), (xii) (B) (I) and (II),
- 10 23-1-302(a)(xxix), 23-1-304(a), (c) and (e) and 23-3-115(c)
- 11 are amended to read:

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13 **11-6-302. Definitions.**

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15 (a) As used in this article:

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(ix) "Predatory animal" means: 1 2 3 (B) Until the date gray wolves are removed 4 from the list of experimental nonessential population, 5 endangered species or threatened species in Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108, "predatory animal" includes 6 wolves. Powers and duties. 7 (a) The commission is directed and empowered: 8 9 10 (xxix) After the date gray wolves are removed 11 from the list of experimental nonessential population, endangered species or threatened species in Wyoming as 12 13 provided by W.S. 23-1-108, to classify gray wolves as 14 predatory or trophy game animals in accordance with W.S. 23-1-304, and to regulate the number of gray wolves which 15 may be taken under a license issued under this act or as 16 17 necessary to carry out the commission's duties under this 18 act. 19 20 23-1-304. Classification of gray wolves. 21 22 (a) The commission shall determine the classification 23 of gray wolves as provided in this section. In making this 24 classification the commission shall rely upon information

provided by department personnel and shall consult with the 1 2 Wyoming animal damage management board created by W.S. 3 11 6 303 and the director of the Wyoming department of 4 agriculture, and consider any additional information 5 provided by that board and by that director by rule and 6 regulation establish areas within the state where gray 7 wolves are classified as trophy game animals and set seasons and bag limits within those areas. The areas 8 9 designated, seasons and bag limits shall be set annually in 10 a manner the commission determines, through rule and 11 regulation, is necessary to reasonably ensure at least 12 seven (7) breeding pairs of gray wolves are located in this 13 state and primarily outside of Yellowstone National Park, 14 Grand Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway at the end of the current calendar year. 15 16 17 (c) For purposes of this section "pack" "breeding pair" means five (5) or more gray wolves traveling 18 19 together. If a group of gray wolves consists of more than 20 ten (10) animals known to be traveling together, the 21 commission may, at its discretion, recognize the number of 22 packs within such a group to be equal to the number of a 23 reproductively mature females bearing male and a female

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1 gray wolf known to be traveling together and having reared 2 young. found within that group of wolves. 3 4 (e) The department shall actively monitor big game 5 animal herd populations statewide to determine whether and to what extent the gray wolf is negatively impacting big 6 7 game animal herds, and thereby hunting opportunities. the extent permitted by this title, and notwithstanding 8 9 other provisions of this title by those means authorized by 10 the commission, the department shall manage the gray wolf 11 population, as necessary to ensure the long-term health and viability of any big game animal herd that is being 12 13 threatened in this state. 14 15 23-3-115. Taking black bear, mountain lion, gray wolf, bobcat, weasel, badger, squirrels or muskrat for 16 17 damaging property. 18 19 (c) The provisions of subsection (a) of this section 20 relating to the taking of animals doing damage to private 21 property shall apply to gray wolves from and after the date 22 gray wolves are removed from the list of experimental nonessential population, endangered species or threatened 23

species in Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108. The owner,

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1 employee or lessee acting under authority of this section

2 shall notify the department of the killing of a gray wolf

3 within an area of the state in which the gray wolf is

4 classified as a trophy game animal. The notification shall

5 be made within ten (10) days of the kill unless the gray

6 wolf was taken in an area where wolves have been classified

7 as trophy game animals pursuant to W.S. $\frac{23}{1} \frac{1}{304} \frac{304}{(b)} \frac{(i)}{(\lambda)}$

9 within seventy-two (72) hours.

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11 Section 2. 2003 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 115,

12 Section 4(c) is amended to read:

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Section 4.

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(c) In order to accomplish the purposes of this act, the game and fish commission shall enter into a memorandum of understanding with appropriate federal agencies under which the commission and federal agencies shall endeavor to manage the prey base for gray wolves in a manner to maintain a sufficient prey base in Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway within the

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1 state for at least eight (8) packs breeding pairs 2 of wolves. The game and fish commission shall 3 endeavor to manage big game populations providing 4 a prey base for seven (7) packs breeding pairs of 5 gray wolves in all other areas of the state in such a manner as to mitigate to the greatest 6 7 extent possible, adverse effects on opportunities for licensed hunters to take big game. 8

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Section 3. W.S. 23-1-304(b) is repealed. 10

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12 **Section 4.** There is appropriated from the general 13 fund to the game and fish commission for the fiscal 14 biennium ending June 30, 2008, two million four hundred thousand dollars (\$2,400,000.00) for purposes of managing 15 16 gray wolves.

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18 Section 5. This act is effective immediately upon 19 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 20 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 21 Constitution.
