A BILL

for

AN ACT relating to game and fish; providing for designation 1 of wolves in specified areas and within specified dates as 2 trophy game animals; providing for management for a 3 specified number of breeding pairs and individual gray 4 wolves; repealing commission authority to enlarge or 5 diminish areas where wolves are managed as trophy game 6 7 animals; repealing governor's authority to change areas 8 where wolves are managed as trophy game animals; limiting 9 commission authority to establish areas where wolves designated as trophy game animals may be taken as predatory 10 11 animals; amending authorized management techniques for controlling wolf populations; providing for use of animal 12 damage management boards funds; specifying legislative 13 intent; providing appropriations; and providing for an 14 effective date. 15

1 (xxix) After the date gray wolves are removed 2 from the list of experimental nonessential population, 3 endangered species or threatened species in Wyoming as 4 provided by W.S. 23-1-108, to classify set seasons and bag 5 limits for gray wolves as predatory or designated as trophy game animals in accordance with pursuant to W.S. 23 1 304 6 23-1-101(a)(xii)(B)(I) and (II), and to regulate the number 7 of gray wolves which may be taken under a license issued 8 9 under this act or as necessary to carry out the commission's duties under this act; 10

(a) The commission shall by rule and regulation establish areas within the state where gray wolves are classified as trophy game animals and set seasons and bag limits and any other requirements necessary to adequately monitor wolf populations within those areas where gray wolves are designated as trophy game animals pursuant to W.S. 23-1-101(a)(xii)(B)(I) and (II). The areas designated, seasons and bag limits shall be set annually in a manner the commission determines, through rule and regulation, only as necessary to reasonably ensure at least seven (7) ten (10) breeding pairs of gray wolves and a

1 total of at least one hundred (100) individual gray wolves

2 are located in this state and primarily outside of

3 Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National Park and

4 John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway and the Wind

5 River Indian Reservation at the end of the current calendar

6 year.

(d) The department shall institute and maintain an 8 9 active program of population monitoring statewide. Population monitoring shall include the use of global 10 11 positioning systems and radio collaring of gray wolves, including use of aerial tracking, necessary to accurately 12 13 determine the population and movement of gray wolves in the state. The commission is authorized to enter into memoranda 14 of understanding with the United States fish and wildlife 15 service or other federal agencies to fund the purchase of 16 17 the necessary technology and to ensure accurate and adequate monitoring of wolf population levels and movements 18 through global positioning systems and 19 radio collar 20 tracking. In all areas of the state, except 21 otherwise provided, any person who harvests a wolf shall 22 notify the department where the harvest occurred within ten (10) days. In areas of the state where gray wolves are 23 24 designated as trophy game animals, any person who harvests

1 <u>a wolf shall notify the department of the harvest and where</u>

2 the harvest occurred within a time period set by rule and

3 regulation, which shall not exceed seventy-two (72) hours.

4 Any information regarding the number or nature of wolves

7 private or confidential nature shall be released without

8 the written consent of the person to whom the information
